

MISSION


To rekindle and establish the spirit of boys who have been abandoned by their fathers; mentoring them one-on-one in life skills through outdoor activities, and by sharing a Christian understanding of our Heavenly Father's love and sacrifice for His Children.

OBJECTIVE

To "heal" the deep, anger filled soul wound that an abandoned boy suffers from and carries with him; thereby stopping the cycle of destruction and abandonment.

50% of this country's children—over 25 million kids under 18—are growing up in homes without their fathers. They live in every community and within reach of every church. Given this knowledge, our Heavenly Father will not tolerate inaction. We are called to help the fatherless, and now we can. And, we must.





The **#1** Societal Issue facing America... A Lost Generation of **BOYS**

When a boy hears from a caring Mentor Father that he has a Father in Heaven who loves him and offers forgiveness through His Son Jesus Christ, the boy is empowered to forgive his earthly father and break free from the torment of abandonment.

THE PAIN

When a **father abandons** his child...

A boy naturally says, "I'll never forgive you!"

Society says, "Forget about him! You don't need a Dad!"

Jesus says, "Forgive him, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you of your sins." (Mark 11:25)

Children from **Fatherless** homes are

- A greater threat to society
- 72% of adolescent murders are committed by fatherless children
- 60% of rapists come from fatherless homes
- 67% of state prison inmates come from fatherless homes
- 85% of juveniles in reform institutions are fatherless
- 30% more likely to abuse drugs and/or alcohol
- Twice as likely to drop out of school
- 11 times more likely to exhibit violent behavior at school
- Dramatically more likely to commit suicide
- More likely to engage in early sexual activity

Consequently, some of His harshest judgments are reserved for those who abuse or take advantage of the fatherless, and on those who sit idly by watching the abuse take place.

Fathers in the Field® was established with the deep conviction to answer God's call to defend the cause of the fatherless through the provision of godly mentoring fathers. The ill effects of growing up without a father upon the boy, the family and our society are profound.

We are confident that through a faithful commitment to a fatherless boy, his future will be much brighter and that godly outdoorsmen will have the distinct privilege of introducing him to the Heavenly Father and to His Son, Jesus Christ.



Great **REWARDS** ...





How the **Journey** works

FATHERS IN THE FIELD® WORKS TO ACHIEVE 3 IMPORTANT GOALS

FAITH

Share and demonstrate to boys that they have a Father in heaven who created, loves and cares for them, and will never forsake them.

Joshua 1:5

FATHERHOOD

Demonstrate fatherly love and commitment, to repair broken spirits and prepare the foundation for future fatherhood.

Deuteronomy 6:6-9

FORGIVENESS

Share the need for boys to forgive the failings of their earthly fathers, as our Heavenly Father forgives His children in Christ.

Mark 11:25

Combining

Faith, Fatherhood, and Forgiveness with the kind of blood-pumping, outdoor Fun that no videogame can match, *Fathers in the Field* works through local churches across America.

Avid outdoorsmen in Christian congregations are empowered and equipped to reach out to fatherless boys in their communities and introduce them to the Father who will never leave or forsake them—God Himself.



CHURCHES, MENTORS, BUDDIES, SINGLE MOMS AND WIDOWS

SPONSORING LOCAL CHURCHES:

Fathers in the Field works through local churches to reach out to abandoned boys in reach of their communities and to approve Mentor Fathers.

FIELD BUDDIES: Fatherless boys ages 7-17 can participate in *Fathers in the Field*.

MENTOR FATHERS: Christian men who love God and the great outdoors serve as Mentor Fathers and are asked to commit to annual relationships with their field buddies.

SINGLE MOMS: *Fathers in the Field* reaches fatherless boys through single mothers who want their sons to have a mature Christian male role model. The

ministry is funded through sponsoring churches so there is no cost to moms.

WIDOWS: Community service is an integral part of *Fathers in the Field* ministry, which identifies widows in need and gives boys an opportunity to serve them and in doing so, gain a sense of accomplishment, helpfulness, and self-worth.



Bonding

Mentor Fathers and their Field Buddies bond through the 12 month journey that includes:

- An end-of-year, multi-day “Adventure Passage” involving adventurous activities like camping, hiking, fishing, boating, hunting, backpacking, rock climbing, horse packing, mountain biking, canoeing, and kayaking—utilizing the outdoor passion of the Mentor Father.
- Community service projects that help build a boy’s self-worth.
- Meaningful conversations that explore God’s love and the issue of forgiveness. These conversations often take place in the majestic setting of the great outdoors—God’s classroom. The boys learn from their Mentor Fathers about the liberating love of their Heavenly Father and the healing that comes through the forgiveness of their fathers who abandoned them.



Fathers in the Field is a non-profit, non para-Church ministry which equips the local Church to ‘Call’ and raise godly men to intentionally mentor the fatherless in their own community.

THE MINISTRY

Founded by a man who was deserted by his own father and struggled with the wound of abandonment for decades before discovering the healing of forgiveness.

Journey Step **Commitments**

Mentor Fathers and boys meet four times a month, using the tools of the ministry, to gain insight and understanding, serve others, worship, and plan a special end of year celebration outdoor activity.

JOURNEY TALKS™

A monthly hands-on activity, progressively preparing for their special year-end “Adventure Passage” event, while incorporating a Life-Journey curriculum that guides boys into authentic Christian manhood. The Mentor Fathers share their love for the Heavenly Father in their comfort zone... God’s Creation.

CHURCH FAMILY

The Mentor Father commits to pick-up and bring his Field Buddy to Sunday school and Church two out of the four Sundays. Here the boys foster their church family relationships that provide caring, faith-nurturing affirmation and instruction of the Heavenly Father’s wisdom and love.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Here the boy develops a serving attitude and learns that he has value, working each month building worth in the process by helping people in need such as widows and the elderly.

ANNUAL “ADVENTURE PASSAGE” EVENT

Boys and Mentor Fathers apply their new knowledge and skills in their own special, multi-day outdoor journey that celebrates their time together and their rite of passage toward authentic manhood.



THOUGHTFUL, FAITHFUL, COMPLETE.

Fathers in the Field is a complete ‘turn-key’ ministry, providing all the instructions, tools and resources you need.

YOU CAN DO THIS!



* Mentor Fathers commit to about 5 hours per month. Mentor Fathers and Field Buddies meet (4) times a month (two of which are Sunday school and Church) and using these tools, gain insight and understanding, serve others, worship, and plan a special outdoor activity so they have a year-end “rite of passage” adventure celebration to prepare and look forward to.

KEITH POLK A MENTOR FATHER’S STORY

Keith Polk, one of the first *Fathers in the Field* Mentor Fathers, recalls the moment when he knew he had made a heart connection with his Field Buddy, Taylor. “We were coming home from turkey hunting. I dropped him off and he turned and waved at me when he walked into the house. I was likely to explode with excitement! Little things like that are important,” exclaims Keith, who, having mentored Taylor for numerous years, has learned to rejoice in the small victories of life with a fatherless boy.

“Taylor’s mom, Daphne, tells me that he used to be full of joy and laughter,” Keith says. “They would play catch together and have a great time. But as he got older, he started throwing the ball so hard that she couldn’t catch it anymore. The reality of his loss set in as he saw his friends out throwing the ball with their dads, while his dad was nowhere in sight. I think it was embarrassing and caused him to draw into a shell.”

For Keith and Taylor the *Fathers in the Field* journey has been one marked by patience, hard-earned trust, and small victories. The wound of abandonment runs deep and mentoring a boy who bears it can be challenging. But as Keith concludes, the reward is far greater. “It’s worth it because it’s what God called me to do. And I get to see Taylor grow. One day, I believe I will see more than a wave when he turns around and walks away. But whether I do or not, I am obedient to the Lord. And, I have grown to love Taylor like a son. I mentor him now because I love him. I want to see him grow like I want to see my own son grow.”







Why Journey Gifts ?

Bonding: Something very emotionally powerful happens when a man gives a gift to a Field Buddy for a job well done.

Incentive: The monthly Journey Gift provides an incentive for the Field Buddy to complete his monthly journey lesson and community service project.

Accountability: The monthly Journey Gift teaches the Field Buddy accountability; if he does not complete his monthly journey lesson or follow through with his other commitments, the gift is withheld until he does.

Practical: They allow the Field Buddy to participate in the end of year outdoor "Adventure Passage" event in safety and comfort.

Financial: They help to relieve any financial burden or embarrassment on the single mom who, in all likelihood, could not afford to outfit her son for the multi-day outdoor adventure.

Shared Vision: The Gifts help relieve any further burden on the Mentor Father in having to pay for outdoor clothing and equipment needs for his Field Buddy. The church family shares in this ministry through their financial contribution.

Heavenly Father: These earthly gifts represent to the abandoned boy the spiritual reality of our Heavenly Father's gifts to His children.



MASEN A FIELD BUDDY'S STORY



Eleven-year-old Masen had never met his father, who abandoned him for a life of crime that ultimately led to prison. The wound of abandonment that Masen carried was not visible on the outside, but it gnawed at him on the inside—producing anger and resentment and convincing him that he was not worthy of a father's love.

In 2006, Masen, then nine years old, was enrolled in *Fathers in the Field* through a local church. Masen's grandmother noticed the *Fathers in the Field* enrollment ad in the newspaper and she called indicating that he needs help and we should call his mother to get Masen enrolled.

Masen and his Mentor Father started planning for their end of year turkey hunt. Masen was introduced to the concept of forgiving his father in month 6 of the 10-month Journey Curriculum. He emphatically and angrily wrote in big, hate-filled letters, that he will NEVER FORGIVE his father.

Over the next couple of months while sharing time together and exploring God's creation, Masen asked his Mentor Father and his Sunday school teacher many questions about this concept; such as, would you forgive your father if he abandoned you? Did Jesus really die for me on the 'cross'? How could God let His Son die on the Cross? Do I really need to be forgiven? Am I a sinner? Many wonderful conversations happened and unfolded in natural and normal settings, like driving to Sunday school and eating lunch under a tree while looking for elk in the Wind River mountains.

One Sunday morning, when his Mentor Father picked him up to take him to Sunday school, Masen

Today, Masen still does not have a relationship with his dad. But, he knows he has a Father in Heaven who loves him and will never leave or forsake him. Through his faith, his relationship with his Mentor Father and his Church family, and the journey they are on together with *Fathers in the Field*, Masen is growing into the young man he never imagined he could be.



boldly and confidently told his Mentor Father that last night he prayed to his Heavenly Father to forgive him and that he accepted His Son, Jesus as his Savior...And, by the way... I forgave my earthly father too. And, I want to be Baptized! To say the least, his Mentor Father was blown away and filled with awesome joy.

They hugged and had such a wonderful drive to Church that day. One month later, Masen was Baptized in witness of his church family, his mother, grandmother, his grandfather, his great grandfather and great grandmother and yes, his Mentor Father.

WHAT A CELEBRATION! PRAISE THE LORD.


However...God's special redemptive plan is not over... Within two weeks of his telling his Mentor Father of being saved in Christ... Masen received the unthinkable. He received a letter from his father in prison wanting to see

him. (God's plan is perfect... that letter would have been torn apart before God softened Masen's heart.)

Masen asked his Mentor Father... what would you do?... and the Mentor Father asked what do you think you should do? Masen thought for a little while and responded... I should go see him and tell him that I forgive him. And, tell him, that I have been forgiven too. Plus, I should tell him about Jesus. Maybe we can spend forever in Heaven together.

What a powerful testimony of God's mercy and love for His children. Masen's wound can finally heal, no longer festering. He has broken the bonds of anger and hatred—and through God's grace, prayerfully the cycle of destruction. He is now whole in Christ.

How to tell if your Church has a Ministry to the **Fatherless?**

The way that a church “knows” - without excuses - if it has a ministry to the fatherless, is if there are abandoned children in their Sunday school and worship service. If there are not, then it does not!

Every church must have a ministry to the fatherless and widow. There is no true church apart from the preaching of the Gospel of Jesus Christ AND the discipleship of the believer in proclaiming the love of Jesus Christ through an “intentional” mercy ministry to the fatherless, widow, prisoner and alien. When the Holy Spirit draws His children into His kingdom, He calls them into service. At the heart of God’s calling is justice and mercy to the fatherless and widow.

The missionary field is not only in distant lands, but in our own backyard. In the United States there are 25

million fatherless children (and rapidly growing) that are in reach of every church.

As the children of Israel are about to take their first step into the Promised Land, God gives them this encouragement and exhortation from Deuteronomy 10. God has set His affections upon them. Now, in return, they are to love the Lord, their God with all of their heart, mind, soul and strength.

What does that love look like? How does God measure that love from His children?

He measures the love of His children by their reflection of His character and their compassion to the fatherless and widow...
